I want to thank everyone in keeping me informed of their intentions on arriving at the BYC docks. There are about 8 out of the 10 members subletting and enjoy having their boats at BYC. Everyone has been very cooperative about moving, but it is still very important that you give me as much notice as possible on bringing your boats on.

The dock audit is currently underway. All boats currently on the docks, including the sublet boats have been measured and compared to their original dock applications, and the docks and the spacing between all boats has also been checked for accuracy. We found that some of the confusion regarding the tags on the docks is that the nametags are "part" of your dock space. In the past, the tags marked the outside of your assigned space. You need to know that the tag marks your entire space, and that you don't have to be in between these tags. The findings of the completed dock audit will be discussed at the June Meeting.

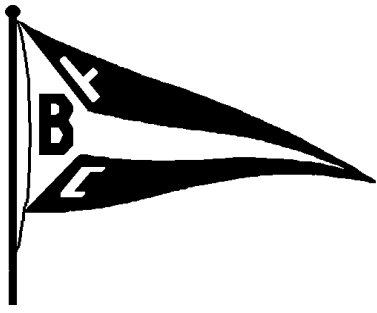
I look forward to seeing everyone at the club and on the docks.

Important Information Inside
Correction Requested

Proposed By Law: *(Those sections in italics is from our current by-laws.*

Those sections underlined are the proposed changes).

A junior member shall be a child between eight (8) years of age and under eighteen (18) years of age, whose parent is a member of the Club. The junior member shall be entitled to limited privileges of the Club, is not entitled to regular club voting, ownership, or docking privileges. A child seeking to become a junior member will make written application to the club. Applications shall be maintained by the membership committee.

In order for a junior member to continue as a member and accrue club seniority he/she must be a son or daughter of a member in good standing. If their parent is not a member in good standing, the junior member loses all seniority and membership rights. He/she must also be an active participant of the various junior membership activities per year as approved by the Board of Trustees. The junior member must also have their dues paid in accordance with Article VI, section 1, or lose any and all seniority accrued. A junior member failing to comply with the activity requirement but paying their dues shall only maintain the seniority previously earned.

The chairman of the junior membership shall report the names of those junior members attaining such seniority at the March general membership meeting. This written list of those junior members who have accrued club seniority will also be given to the membership committee chairman for proper record keeping and for calculating of club seniority when necessary.

This seniority will be granted only to sons or daughters of club members and will be equal to one half of the time of junior membership up to a maximum of three (3) years, provided that the junior membership is continuous. Any child who has been participating with the junior membership and has an application on file prior to January 1, 2000, shall be recognized as a past junior member but seniority will only apply to sons or daughters of members. Immediately upon reaching the age of 18 a junior must apply for membership and pay an application fee of \$100.00 dollars. Any junior member desiring a special exemption regarding membership at age eighteen shall submit a written request to the Board of Trustees for their review and consideration prior to turning eighteen. The admission or entrance fee for membership as a regular member shall be the same as listed in Article VI, Section 1 and Section 2. The membership committee will process the application as any other club application and once accepted, this member will also comply with Article IV Section 11 and all other by-laws. Seniority will be applied once the member has been accepted as a regular or proprietary member.
